C.&D. Coy. THE KING'S (LIVERPOOL REGIMENT).

Officially reported WOUNDED & MISSING 3rd MAY 1917 thought to be probably a Prisoner of War in German Hands.

LAST SEEN North side of OPPY WOOD (N.E. of Arras) on morning of 3rd MAY about 7 a.m. wounded in the shoulder and leaning against the side of the German Trench as the Germans re-entered it and took possession.

AGE, 31 years.

HEIGHT, about 5ft. 9in. Thin, rather slight build.

COMPLEXION, good, medium colour, neither bright-coloured nor sallow.

FEATURES, good, long shaped head & chin. Fairly large nose. Teeth regular and good. Cleanshaven.

HAIR, dark brown. EYES, gray blue.

NATIONALITY, British.

He would probably have an Ingersoll watch on his, and generally carried a small book in his pocket, a Shakespear play or some such work. Also a small Testament. He went in to action with his neck in bandages.

His REGIMENTAL BADGE is a HORSE with, on a scroll underneath, "THE KING'S". The Badge would be on Cap, collar and Cuffs, & perhaps Buttons. Probably has Three Stars on his Cuffs.

COMPLEXION, dark. EYES, dark brown.

HAIR, black, turning very gray. FEATURES, straight, very handsome.

NATIONALITY, English, Born at Croydon 21st December 1873.

His REGIMENTAL BADGE is a HORSE with "THE KING'S" on a scroll underneath. The Badge would be on Collar, Cuffs, Cap & Buttons. Three Stars on Cuffs.
